## **II. COURSE DESCRIPTION**

Prerequisite: College Level Reading

General Psychology II is the scientific study of behavior. Topics include cognition, language, stress and coping, psychological assessment, personality, abnormal psychology, therapy, life-span development, and social psychology. GT-SS3

This Web course covers fundamental principles and major concepts of psychology using original footage of classic experiments, interviews with renowned psychologists, and documentaries of emerging research. The video programs often feature real-life situations that help students recognize and appreciate how psychology affects the lives of ordinary people and themselves.

- B. Compare and contrast personality from the perspectives of theory and assessment.
- C. Identify the factors involved in stress and effective strategies for management of stress.
- D. Discuss abnormal psychology in terms of major disorders.
- E. Identify the major forms of therapy used in treating psychological disorders.
- F. Identify major psychological, physical and social influences on human development throughout life.
- G. Analyze the social influences on behavior.
- H. Write or speak clearly and logically in presentations or essays.
- I. Demonstrate the ability to select and apply contemporary forms of technology to solve problems or compile information.
- J. Read, analyze and apply written materials to new situations.
